## WHAT IS THE INDIAN CHILD WELFARE ACT?

The Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA) is a federal law passed in 1978 “to protect the best interests of Indian children and to promote the stability and security of Indian tribes and families” (25 U.S.C. § 1902). It was created in response to the large number of Native children being removed from their families by state child welfare and private adoption agencies. ICWA regulates State courts, State child protection agencies, and adoption agencies regarding the handling of child abuse and neglect, and adoption cases involving an Alaskan Native or American Indian child, who is a member of or eligible for membership in a federally recognized tribe. The law requires states to search for placements within the recognized extended family or culture first, before placing with non-Native families. ICWA allows tribes to intervene, participate in court hearings, and make decisions in child in need of aid (CINA) cases as well as in adoption cases.

## WHAT IS AN ICWA WORKER?

If a youth or one or both of their parents are Alaska Native and a member of a Tribe or eligible to be a member of a Tribe, there may be an Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA) worker assigned to an OCS case. ICWA workers work for the Tribe and can attend court hearings in both tribal court and state court. They also attend meetings about a child’s case and can make recommendations on behalf of the Tribe.

**HOW DO I CONTACT AN ICWA WORKER?** To find out if an ICWA worker is assigned to a case, ask the caseworker, guardian ad litem (GAL) or CASA. You can also contact the child’s Tribe and ask to talk to their ICWA worker. The Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) has a Tribal Leaders Directory which is regularly updated: <https://www.bia.gov/bia/ois/tribal-leaders-directory/>

## WHAT IS A CERTIFICATE OF DEGREE OF INDIAN BLOOD?

A Certificate of Degree of Indian Blood (CDIB) is a very important document for American Indian or Alaska Native people. The certificate allows Alaska Native and American Indian peoples access to Native health care, social services and other resources, which are usually at no cost. The CDIB is issued by the U.S. Department of the Interior - Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA). <https://www.bia.gov/>

**HOW DO I GET A CDIB?** To apply, a *Request for Certificate of Degree of Indian or Alaska Native Blood* must be completed and submitted. The degree of Indian blood is computed from lineal ancestors of Indian blood who were enrolled with a federally recognized Indian tribe or whose names appear on the designated base rolls of a federally recognized Indian tribe. More information can be found at: <https://www.bia.gov/guide/tracing-american-indian-and-alaska-native-aian-ancestry> If a child you are caring for does not have a CDIB card, contact your social worker, ICWA worker, or tribal administrator to assist in obtaining it. A certified copy of the child’s birth certificate is required to establish the relationship to the parent(s) enrolled with a federally recognized tribe. If a child has not received a CDIB before adoption, the names and birth dates of the biological parents and possibly grandparents will also be required.

## WHAT IS TRIBAL ENROLLMENT?

Many people confuse tribal membership with being a shareholder in either an Alaska Native Regional Corporation or an Alaska Native Village Corporation. Tribal membership refers to being a member of a federally recognized tribe which is a self-governing entity. Most tribes do not require a minimum Native blood quantum. A person can apply to the tribe their parents or ancestors belong or belonged to by proving lineal descent with either a birth certificate, baptismal record, or adoption paperwork. A tribal member does not have to reside in the village to which they belong. Tribal members can live and work anywhere in the United States and still receive some of the same supports offered to tribal members residing in their village.

**HOW DO I FIND MY TRIBE?** In Alaska, usually the name of the Tribe will be the same or similar to the name of the village you or your relatives were raised in. The caseworker or ICWA worker may be able to help identify your Tribe and also help with getting enrolled. You can also contact the Regional Corporation that covers the region you or your parents grew up in as they may be able to help identify the village. *Resource B* at the back of this handbook lists the Federally recognized Tribes in Alaska.

**WHY SHOULD I ENROLL WITH MY TRIBE?** Most importantly, Tribal membership will allow you to receive a wide variety of services from your affiliated Alaska regional organization, such as health care, child care, and employment training. Also, Tribes may offer scholarships or educational and employment opportunities for its members.

## WHAT ARE ALASKA NATIVE CORPORATIONS?

In 1971 the Alaska Native Land Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA) was passed. This legislation was enacted to return some of Alaska's lands and natural resources to Alaska's Indigenous peoples. Alaska was divided into 12 regions which formed for-profit *regional* corporations to be managed by eligible Alaska Native shareholders residing within the region. Within each region, for-profit *village* corporations were also formed to be managed by eligible Alaska Native shareholders residing within the village. **HOW DO I BECOME A SHAREHOLDER?** When ANCSA was originally passed, shareholders had to meet a blood quantum of at least  $\frac{1}{4}$  Alaska Native blood *and* have been born on or before 11:59pm on December 18, 1971. Those who met the criteria received 100 shares of stock from the Regional corporation and 100 shares from the Village corporation (*if* they were affiliated with a village). Since the passage of ANCSA, some corporations have voted to open enrollment to those born after December 18, 1971 and removed the blood quantum requirement. New shareholders are issued a different type of stock share which may not have the same benefits (such as being eligible to receive dividends) as original shareholders. The only way to obtain *original* stock shares is through inheritance or gifting. All types of stock shares can only be inherited. They cannot be sold or bartered. Even if stock shares are not issued to descendants of shareholders, many Alaska Native corporations provide benefits to descendants, such as funding for educational and internship programs and scholarships so it's important to find out if a youth's parents are shareholders in a Native corporation.

**WHAT ARE DIVIDENDS?** Every year each corporation determines if they've earned enough profit to issue dividends (money) to its eligible shareholders. If a youth who is eligible to receive money is in OCS custody, the Native corporation should hold the funds until the youth is 18 years old or if a custodian has been named on their stock certificate. If a youth owns stock shares, it's important to contact the Native corporation to inform them of the youth's status so they can hold the funds for the youth.

# HEALTHCARE, SOCIAL & EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

Indian Health Service (IHS) is a division within the US Department of Health and Social Services responsible for providing medical and public health services to members of federally-recognized Native American Tribes and Alaska Native people. The Alaska Area Indian Health Service works in conjunction with Alaska Native Tribes and Tribal Organizations to provide **healthcare, social, and educational services** for Alaska Native people through regional non-profit organizations organized with the passage of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA). The regions are shown in the map below. Generally, a person has to obtain medical care from their tribally affiliated region, but may be referred to another regional organization for additional care. Following is a list of the Alaska Regional Organizations and the region and tribes they represent. Usually, a Certificate Degree of Indian Blood (CDIIB) is required to receive services from these entities.


