
## **MY CHILDS RIGHTS**

- 2. I have the right not to be asked to CHOOSE which parent I want to live with. I also have the right to express a PREFERENCE if I have one.
- 3. I have the right to BE WITH BOTH MY PARENTS, regardless of grown up wants and wishes regarding convenience, money or feelings.
- 4. I have the right to CONSISTENCY and a dependable daily and weekly ROUTINE, one that is not filled with alternating patterns and disruptions.
- 5. I have the right to be angry, sad, and fearful, and to EXPRESS MY FEELINGS.
- 6. I have the right to LOVE BOTH MY PARENTS, since they are both a part of me, and to be reassured that this is ok.
- 7. I have the right not to be asked to BLAME or to CHOOSE SIDES.
- 8. I am a child, I have the right to be a CHILD. Don't ask me to act like an ADULT or to make ADULT decisions. It is not my responsibility to be a friend or comforter to either parent.
- 9. I have the right to expect my parents TO BE ADULT ENOUGH TO UNDERSTAND that if I need to be with one of them, it does not mean I love the other less.
- 10. I have the right to HAVE MY SAY, BUT NOT MY WAY.
- 11. I have the right not to be asked to serve as a MESSENGER between my parents.
- 12. I have the right not to have to hear my parents ARGUE and FIGHT in front of me.
- 13. I have the right not to have to hear my parents say BAD THINGS about each other or each other's friends and family.
- 14. Don't GRILL ME; I have the right NOT TO HAVE TO TELL one parent what goes on in the other's home.
- 15. If a parent harms me or places me at risk, I have the right to TELL ANYONE.
- 16. I have the right not to be asked to keep SECRETS from one parent.
- 17. I have the right not to be involved in CHILD SUPPORT AND MONEY ISSUES.
